Sermons at First Lutheran Church (ELCA) Reggie Denton, Pastor

March 5, 2023 (2nd Sunday in Lent, Year A) John 3:1-17

"The wind blows where it chooses and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes."

Ah the wind. I remember working with my grandfather in the summer, putting up hay. My younger brother and I would be up in the hay loft all the way up in the peak. After working all day already, we would then go up into the heat of that hay loft. And we would just be dripping with sweat. We would be so exhausted and the dust from the hay was all over us. We come down out of there after we'd finish a wagon, and we would just be covered in black dust, head to toe. So when we came out, we really wanted to come out, because inside the air was just still, dead air. But when we came out, we could feel the wind. And that wind was so refreshing. I could catch my breath. I could feel the strength coming back into my body, knowing that I would need to go back up there again.

God's Spirit is like. It fills us and refreshes us, and sends us back out.

About 2 years ago, I buried my father-in-law. Now Roger Wangerin was one of those persons that you would call a free spirit. As a free spirit, this was a man who you didn't know when he was going to show up, IF he was going to show up, and when he GOT there, WHAT he was going to SAY. He was the kind of man that would show up at a wedding reception he WASN'T INVITED to, for people he'd never MET. He was the life of the party. Everybody loved that man. In his funeral sermon, I described him as a person who was like the wind – always stirring things up. He WAS the RUSTLING wind.

A man like that, you tend to want to put him into a <u>BOX</u>. This guy was a <u>CERTAIN TYPE</u> of person. <u>BUT</u> Roger was <u>ALSO BORN</u> of the Spirit. Not just a <u>FREE</u> spirt, but <u>BORN</u> of the Spirit. He was <u>ALSO</u> a man who was in church <u>EVERY</u> Sunday. And brought his <u>CHILDREN</u> to church <u>EVERY</u> Sunday. And was also one of the <u>FOUNDING</u> members of a mission congregation when he moved out to suburbs of the Cities. He was a <u>VERY FAITHFUL CHRISTIAN</u>. Both a <u>FREE</u> spirit and <u>BORN</u> of the spirit. He didn't <u>FIT</u> in just that <u>ONE BOX</u>.

What the Spirit teaches us, as it taught <u>ME</u>, is that you can't put God in boxes. You can't put <u>PEOPLE</u> on boxes. God used Roger to <u>TEACH</u> me that God uses people that we don't expect God to use – all kind of people, all kinds of personalities. And so, my understanding was stretched, and that's what the Spirit <u>DOES</u>.

Show cartoon "Jesus the eraser boxes." Describe for radio audience.

This is my favorite cartoon. The people are annoyed by Jesus erasing their boxes, but they don't get to <u>DECIDE</u>; <u>JESUS</u> gets to decide. <u>GOD WON'T</u> be <u>PUT</u> into <u>BOXES</u>.

That's something that happens in this story. Nicodemus has a misunderstanding with Jesus. And he wants to put God into a box. Jesus says that people must be born from above, and Nicodemus misunderstands him, because the word Jesus uses to mean "born from above" can ALSO mean "born again." Nicodemus takes "born again," and he runs with it. "Born again?! What do you MEAN, I can't be born a SECOND TIME!" And Jesus says, "No, born from ABOVE, born of the SPIRIT."

We <u>STILL</u> have that <u>SAME</u> disagreement in the <u>CHURCH</u>. We have this argument between <u>DENOMINATIONS</u> – what does "born again" <u>MEAN</u>? A lot of churches say that you must be <u>BORN AGAIN</u> in order to <u>REALLY BE</u> a <u>CHRISTIAN</u>.

Well, when I was dating my future wife, Wendy, I <u>LEARNED</u> something about this. I was a born again Christian. I'd become a Christian when I was in high school, and was really getting fired up

about my faith in college. I remember one day, we were driving and we were talking, and I'd been influenced by my friends who were evangelicals who HAD that way of thinking. So I thought that born again was HOW you BECAME a Christian, and if you HADN'T had the born again experience, then you WEREN'T REALLY a CHRISTIAN. And my girlfriend told me that she had ALWAYS been a Christian; she was BORN a Christian. A cradle Lutheran. She had been a LUTHERAN here whole LIFE. And I questioned her — if you haven't been born again, are you REALLY a CHRISTIAN? And my future wife, she said, "HOW **DARE** YOU...QUESTION WHETHER I'M REALLY A CHRISTIAN! I've been a Christian a lot longer than YOU." And I tell you, that woman put the FEAR OF GOD in me. And I learned something that day.

In the course of going to a Lutheran college, and marrying a Lutheran girl, and going to a Lutheran seminary, I've really come to EMBRACE this idea. As a Lutheran PASTOR, and KNOWING, and KNOWING that God LOVES you, I ENVY that.

Being a born again Christian meant that I had to slip into the <u>PIT OF DESPAIR</u> first, to hit <u>ROCK BOTTOM</u> before I could reach for God, and <u>YOU LUTHERANS</u> haven't needed to go <u>THROUGH</u> that. So <u>WHY ON EARTH</u> would I <u>REQUIRE</u> my <u>PIT OF DESPAIR</u> of someone else. <u>WHY</u> would I <u>WISH</u> that on <u>ANYONE</u>? I <u>ENVY YOU</u>, who didn't <u>NEED</u> to go through that, who've just KNOWN God's love your whole life.

So my GOD BOX got EXPLODED.

But then I went to <u>SEMINARY</u>, and in seminary, you're around all these theologically trained <u>LUTHERANS</u>. They believed that only way you can become a Christian is by <u>GOD WORKING</u> on you. God is doing <u>ALL</u> of the work, and there's <u>NO SUCH THING</u> as a born again Christian. And here I was, an actual born again Christian. We'd have these conversations, and they would say, "Your experience of giving up and giving yourself to God – that was just an <u>ILLUSION</u>. That was actually God doing all that <u>IN</u> you." That was a <u>PROBLEM</u> for me. Over the next 4 years of seminary, I <u>CHALLENGED</u> my classmates. I told them that the experience of being born again – it may be <u>OBJECTIVELY TRUE</u> that God works that <u>IN</u> a person, but don't discount the <u>EXPERIENCE</u>. Born again Christians are <u>REAL</u> Christians too. The experience is real.

So I exploded THEIR little box of how God works.

You see, God <u>WON'T BE PUT</u> in <u>BOXES</u> of <u>HOW WE</u> think God works. We're not God. God works in much <u>BIGGER</u> and <u>BETTER</u> ways.

So we have this disagreement in the church, between denominations about <u>HOW</u> God works, how God <u>MAKES</u> a Christian. But there are 5 questions that we are supposed to ask, right? Who, what, where, why and how. So we may disagree but <u>HOW</u> God works, but Jesus himself is very CLEAR about the OTHER 4.

WHO is acting? Well, it's GOD, who gave his ONLY SON.

WHAT does God do? Jesus says, "God SO LOVED."

<u>WHERE</u> does it happen? It happens in the <u>WHOLE WORLD</u>. Not just in <u>THIS CHURCH</u>, or <u>THAT</u> church, or this or that <u>TYPE</u> of church; it happens <u>EVERYWHERE</u> in the <u>WHOLE WORLD</u>. <u>WHY</u> does it happen? So "all who believe in him may ... have eternal life."

(Put John 3:16 on the screen)

You heard this in our Gospel reading. You <u>KNOW</u> this verse. Many of you have <u>MEMORIZED</u> this verse. Jesus says <u>EVERYTHING</u> here. Let's read it together: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life."

Do you see it? The who, what, where and why? In that 1 verse, Jesus says it ALL.

We may not agree on everything, we may argue about our <u>BOXES</u>, but when it comes to the <u>IMPORTANT</u> stuff, Jesus said <u>EVERYTHING</u> that <u>NEEDS</u> to be <u>SAID</u>: "God so loved the world, that he gave his only son." Amen.
