John 14:15-21
Mothers Day

I want to begin today with a nod to all you mothers out there.

Happy Mothers Day. I know it's a commercial, but I don't care. It's good.

I hope you caught the intimacy between mother and child in that clip.

That's what Jesus is talking about in our Gospel today. We have a God who is <u>CLOSE</u>. Jesus said, "I will not leave you orphaned...Those who love me will be loved by my Father, and I too will love them and reveal myself to them."

He used the word "orphaned." That's a <u>POWERFUL</u> choice of words there. He could have simply said "I will not leave you alone," but "<u>ORPHANED</u>" says a lot <u>MORE</u>, doesn't it? To be orphaned means to have <u>NO ONE</u>, <u>NO ONE</u> that loves you, to be <u>ABANDONED</u>, to be <u>COMPLETELY ALONE</u>.

Alone. We can <u>ALL</u> relate to <u>THAT</u>. In a world as immense and complicated as ours, it's easy to think of ourselves as having no value – cogs in a machine, numbers in a computer, faceless, nameless, unnoticed by the universe. We feel powerless. We feel like no one's listening to us. We feel disenfranchised, left behind, left out, like NO ONE is looking out for us.

And there is something <u>WRONG</u> with this world. These days it seems like the world is <u>QUICK</u> to "orphan" people. It rejects the odd, routinely ignores the unusual, redefines the acceptable, and is repulsed by those out of the ordinary. It "orphans" the poor. It "orphans" the elderly. It "orphans" the addicts. It "orphans" the outsiders. It "orphans" all those who do not comfortably fit <u>ITS</u> standards.

But we have <u>NOT</u> been ORPHANED. We have a God who is <u>CLOSE</u>. Jesus said, "Those who love me will be loved by my Father, and I too will love them and reveal myself to them."

Jesus is saying, <u>FIRST</u> of all, that we are <u>LOVED</u>. We have been adopted. In our Baptism, we have been <u>CLAIMED</u> and given a <u>NEW</u> name – child of God. It's not just <u>ANYONE</u> who has claimed us. God HIMSELF has looked at us with love and said, "THIS one's mine. I choose YOU."

It's very comforting. But there's <u>MORE</u> to the image than <u>FEELINGS</u> – it's <u>POWERFUL</u>. Not <u>ONLY</u> does Christ love us, Christ is <u>ALWAYS WITH</u> us. "I am in my Father," says Christ to <u>US</u>, "and you are <u>IN</u> me, and I am <u>IN</u> you." We often skip over lines like this, but <u>DON'T</u> skip over <u>THAT</u>. That's <u>HUGE</u>! Christ is <u>WITHIN</u> us. We don't have to go to a mountaintop to find God. We don't have to peer through the Webb telescope. All we need to do is to listen for the Divine whisper from within our <u>OWN</u> HEARTS.

That's more than <u>COMFORT</u>; <u>THAT'S STRENGTH</u>. The God who <u>ABIDES</u> with us will help us <u>ENDURE ANYTHING</u>. We can <u>CALL</u> on Jesus to <u>HELP</u> us do the things we <u>CAN'T</u> do on our own. He'll give us the strength to say a <u>KIND</u> word, <u>ESPECIALLY</u> when we don't <u>WANT</u> to. The strength to <u>FIND</u> time to spend with our families. To keep <u>HOPE</u> in the face of illness. To <u>REBUILD</u> when we've <u>LOST</u> everything. To find the <u>COURAGE</u> to go <u>ON</u> when we've lost a friend or a loved one. We can <u>FACE</u> tomorrow, because Christ <u>LOVES</u> us, and Christ is <u>WITH</u> us.

Jesus will <u>NOT</u> leave you orphaned. You are loved, and we have a God who is <u>CLOSE</u>. When you're tired and weak, you can rest in his comforting arms. He'll give you the strength you need to cope with life. He'll give you the courage to <u>CONQUER</u> those things that would <u>KEEP</u> you from following his ways.

And when it's too <u>MUCH</u> to <u>HANDLE</u>, just <u>CALL</u> for him. He comes in the Holy Spirit, and he is <u>ALWAYS WITH</u> you. And that <u>SPIRIT</u>, the Spirit of God, the Spirit of Jesus, He will <u>NEVER</u> let you go, <u>NEVER</u> give up on you...<u>NEVER</u>. God will <u>NOT</u> leave you orphaned. <u>YOU ARE LOVED</u>. Amen.
